

The Gift of Baptism

Baptism is a gift for your child, as well as your whole family and the Catholic Church. When your child is baptized, the grace of the sacrament brings "new life" in Christ that remains eternally.

You have chosen to have your child baptized, which is a sign of your faith in God and of the love you have for your child. Keep in mind that God also has faith in you. Every child is a sign of how much trust God has in parents, not just to love and care for the children, but to show them how great God's love is for everyone.

We believe that God has wonderfully made every person and calls us each by name. In baptism we join the community of the faithful and together we work to build God's kingdom on earth, as in heaven. Our mission, then, is to proclaim our faith in Jesus Christ with our families and with the universal Church. In doing so, God's love becomes visible to all people just as Jesus revealed God's love in his life and death.

On the day of the baptism you will bring your child to church with the child's godparents (sponsors). Other close friends and family members may wish to join you. The baptism may take place during Mass with the parish community or at a separately designated time in the church. It is important that you be prepared, not just for this one day of celebrating the sacrament, but by taking the time to be fully aware of your role in your child's faith development.



## One Faith, One Baptism, One Family in Christ

This booklet provides some basic instruction to help you prepare for the rite of baptism, and you will always have the opportunity to ask at your parish for specific information. Whether you are bringing your first child to be baptized or have previously prepared for the baptism of another child, you may have questions about the sacrament.

The sacraments are acts of the whole Church, celebrated together in order to deepen our awareness of Christ's presence in our lives. Three of the seven sacraments are called the sacraments of initiation:

**Baptism** 

**Eucharist** 

### **Confirmation**

The Sacrament of Baptism opens the door to receive the other sacraments. As children grow up, they watch and imitate their parents, the first examples of faith in action. From generation to generation faith in Jesus Christ remains alive in the love we share with one another and with the world.



You may have already sensed that your pastor (or his delegate) is keenly interested in the sincerity of your faith. The foundation of children's faith development, especially in the early years, depends on their parents' commitment to continue teaching them about Jesus and to create an environment that invites the Holy Spirit to touch their hearts.

Your child's journey of faith formally begins with baptism. No matter how active you have been in your prayer life or how often you have participated in the sacraments prior to the day of the baptism, you will make a promise to teach your child by regularly practicing your faith. The Church, in turn, makes a promise to be with you on this journey.

We are not believers in Jesus because we have been baptized and receive the sacraments. Rather, because of our belief in Jesus we desire to be one in faith with others as the Body of Christ. Baptism is the outward symbol of our promise to live and act as members of the Body of Christ. We follow Christ in how we live our lives with the support of one another.

> The gift of Baptism for your child remains with them forever. In the words of Pope Francis, "the greatest inheritance that you can give your children is faith."
