

All Gospel summaries are based on the Contemporary English Version, Bible for Today's Family: New Testament (© 1991, American Bible Society). This is the translation used in the Lectionary for Masses with Children (© 1992, United States Catholic Conference), which is approved for use in all dioceses of the United States.

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The Readings

The readings cited are the readings that the children heard that Sunday. These readings may differ at times from those heard by the adults. They may be shorter, there may be only one reading, plus the Psalm and the Gospel, or the First Readings may be different altogether from those the adults hear. The Gospel most always is the same, but may be the shorter form. The *Directory for Masses With Children* allows for these differences to accommodate the children's level of comprehension.

Activities

Here are some suggestions, but all three activities could be used at any time. The first bonus activity is related to the First Reading for the Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time (October 8), where God asks Adam to name all the birds and animals. The second bonus activity teaches about the unique gifts God has given each of us. This can especially be used for the Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time (October 19). The third bonus activity can be used any time ahead of the Season of Advent.


The Word of God This Week



Jesus Is the Messiah

Jesus asked his disciples, "Who do you say I am?" Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of God."

Jesus told him, "Simon, you were shown this by my Father in Heaven. From now on, I will call you Peter, which means 'rock,' and on this rock I will build my Church. I will give you the keys to Heaven, and God will allow whatever you allow on earth and will not allow whatever you don't allow."

FAITH FOCUS

Jesus was a carpenter and knew the importance of good materials. When he chose Peter as the foundation for his Church, he knew he would be a solid role model for all believers.
