

First Thursday of Advent


DECEMBER 4 ★ SAINT JOHN DAMASCENE

Second Tuesday & Advent


DECEMBER 9 ★ SAINT JUAN DIEGO CUAUHTLATOATZIN

Today's Gospel » Matthew 18:12-14

Jesus said, "If a shepherd has a hundred sheep, and one of them has gone astray, does he not leave the ninety-nine on the mountains and go in search of the one that went astray?" (18:12)

Jesus is our shepherd, and you are one of his sheep. Even if you were in a room with 100 people, Jesus could pick you out. The angel wasn't leading them in circles after all!




Fourth Sunday of Advent

Today's Gospel » Matthew 1:18-24

When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took Mary as his wife (1:24).
